Australia's Great Barrier Reef, pictured on this prayer card, is the world's largest coral reef. It stretches 2,300 kilometres along the Queensland coast and supports a rich diversity of life, including many vulnerable and endangered species. Parts of the reef are protected by the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park, however much of the reef is threatened by climate change, catchment pollution, coastal development and fishing. Responding to these issues with a sense of humility requires for many of us a candid examination of lifestyle choices, a realisation that creation is sacred and endangered, and a radical change of heart - an 'ecological conversion'.

Help us likewise to treasure the myriad creatures of the reefs, the deep-bedded minerals, the unique vegetation and animals of this land; may our respect for them enhance us as a people and help us live properly with our neighbours in other lands. Help us to treasure the small creatures that have no use for us but are just themselves. Help us maintain the tissue of delicate connections that hold Your creation in its immense and gentle power.

We believe, like Pope Francis, that the time has come to act – with a deepened sense of responsibility, with understanding and courage and wisdom – in the details of our daily lives, the habits of our local communities and the policies of our nation. We pray that we do not act too late; we pray that we act effectively.

We ask this so that we can be joined now and in the future in our canticle of praise for Your creation by our fellow creatures, great and small, and by the cycle of the seasons, the great currents of the oceans and the tiniest of creatures even our science has not discovered.
