This coming week Catholic Earthcare staff will be participating on the climate leadership training being held in Brisbane. We are being asked to decide on Australia's response to our climate emergency. While some argue that at just 1% of the global emissions, Australia has little impact, I argue we have significant moral imperative to demonstrate action, economy clout to innovate and build a sustainable economy.

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The biblical texts are to be read in their context, with an appropriate hermeneutic, recognising that they tell us to "till and keep" the garden of the world (cf. Gen 2:15)

We know that there are some great things happening to care for our common home right across Australia in the education, health sectors and individual parishes.


We also know that there has been no way of bringing people together to share their journeys face to face and electronically in a methodical and systematic way so that we can build success upon success.
