



## **STEP 3** Student-Led Environmental Review: Primary

**Step 3** is an Environmental Review to identify the good things that your school is already doing for the environment. It will also help you to find things for your school to improve in.

The Environmental Review can be completed by a class, the Earthcare committee or each topic could be given to a different class to involve the whole school. There are five questions for each topic and a comments box to record any ideas you have . At the end of the review you can calculate your school's score out of 60 by giving a point for every yes.

The Environmental Review has only three rules:

- 1. The questions have to be answered by children (they can ask a teacher for help
- 2. You must answer every question.
- 3. You must inform the whole school about what you have discovered
