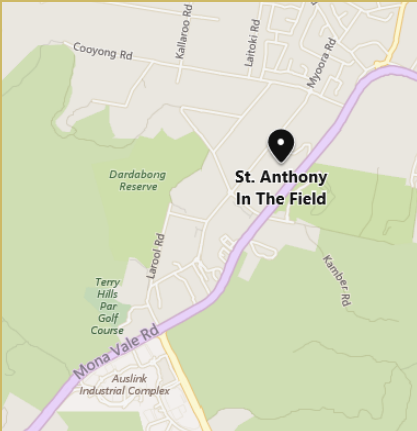

refuge since 2013.



The site is a Landcare site.  
Kierans Creek, which rises from a  
nearby spring, hosts wildlife  
endangered by unsympathetic  
development and habitat loss.  
Its winding route to the Hawkesbury  
River and Broken Bay connects St  
Anthony in the Fields community to the  
many ecological communities along its  
way to the ocean.
