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INTRODUCTION: LAUDATO SI' IN ACTION

<u>Catholic Earthcare Australia</u> is a program of <u>Caritas Australia</u>. Founded by the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference, Catholic Earthcare Australia promotes understanding that creation is sacred and must be protected and preserved for present and future generations.

It is mandated, through the activities of education, research and advocacy to give leadership in responding to <u>Pope John Paul II's call</u> to "encourage and support the 'ecological conversion' ". It responds to the call of <u>Laudato Si'</u>, the environmental encyclical in which Pope Francis invited Catholics all around the world to reflect, pray and take action to protect our common home.

The Australian Catholic Bishops Social Justice Statement for 2021-22, 'Cry of the Earth, Cry of the Poor', further supports our call to care for all creation and invites us to take action.

In support of this statement and the seven-year <u>Laudato Si' Action Platform</u>, Catholic Earthcare Australia has developed a certification process for parishes.



INTRODUCTION: LAUDATO SI' IN ACTION

Being an Earthcare Parish is about putting Laudato Si' into action. It is a hopeful gesture and, as the <u>Dicastery for Promoting Integral Human Development's Laudato Si Action Platform</u> emphasises, such a response to the present ecological crisis is also "a profound act of care".

"At this kairos moment, action is needed. The <u>Laudato Si' Goals</u> guide our actions. Their holistic approach supports a spiritual and cultural revolution as we strive for total sustainability in the spirit of integral ecology." <u>Source</u>

The Laudato Si' Goals are a key focus for Earthcare Parishes and an important reminder that "humanity still has the ability to work together for our common home" (Pope Francis, *Laudato Si'* n 13).

EARTHCARE STEPS TO ECOLOGICAL DIALOGUE

The Earthcare Steps to Ecological Dialogue are designed to guide planning and implementation of positive change actions in organisations. They flow from research into the way organisations move through different phases of change, and build on Professor John Kotter's 8-step change framework illustrated in the central analogy of *Our Iceberg Is Melting* (1996).

Our Earthcare Steps to Ecological Dialogue adapts Kotter's framework for Catholic churches in Australia. These steps underpin the approach to organisational change within the Dicastery for Promoting Integral Human Development's 7 touchstones of family, school, university, hospital/health, business, agriculture and religious orders.

Now, as you start on as an Earthcare Parish, and in future as you continue your ecological journey together, these Steps to Ecological Dialogue will help you engage your whole community in ecological conversation, conversion and action.

BECOMING AN EARTHCARE PARISH

Our Earthcare Parish Program aims to assist parishes on their way to becoming Laudato Si' communities. Our Earthcare Parish certification process is an initial 3-step process designed to inform, guide, inspire and celebrate parish action towards sustainability and care for our common home.

Step 1: REGISTER

<u>Register via the Survey</u> to receive your Earthcare Parish Certificate (and your first star) and the Earthcare Parish Audit Tool to begin your ecological conversion.




Step 2: AUDIT

Review your parish's current contributions towards sustainability and care for our common home, using our <u>Earthcare Parish Audit Tool</u>. Send the completed document through to our Earthcare Team who will award a second star and be ready to support you as you plan your next steps.



Step 3: ACT

Create an <u>Earthcare Parish Action Planner</u>, using the 7 <u>Laudato Si' Goals</u> to guide and inspire your people, place and practice towards integral ecology. Send your completed document through to our Earthcare Team who will award a third star in celebration of your commitment to ecological practice. From there, we'll continue to support and encourage you as you put your plan into action. And you'll earn extras stars for the actions you tick off in your first, second and third years!
