

Level 1

Usually requires the completion of Year 10 schooling, the Secondary School Certificate, Certificate I or Certificate II qualification. New Apprenticeships may be offered in this level.

Level 2

Usually has a skill level equal to a Certificate III or IV or at least three years relevant experience. Australian Apprenticeships may be offered in this level.

Usually requires a level of skill equal to a Diploma or Advanced Diploma. Study is often undertaken through TAFEs or Registered Training Organisations.

Usually requires completion of a bachelor degree or higher qualification. Study is often undertaken

from the Guide to Environmental Careers in Australia, produced by the Environmental Jobs Network, in conjunction with the School of Social Science

and Planning at RMIT, and funded by the Australian Government Department of the Environment and Heritage.
